

In case, if the applicant wants to leave or resigns before the bond period then the appointee will have to make the payment of his/her salary for the remaining period of the bond in a single installment.
6. The applications of such appointees will not be entertained or forwarded for outside employment by the Vishwa Vidyalaya during the bond period.

* Essentiality of NET can be waived off for the applicants holding Ph.D. degree in concerned subject done with course work as prescribed by the UGC regulation 2009 subject to the condition of producing a NET exemption certificate as mentioned in Annexure-I and having two full length publications having NAAS rating not less than 4. **The applicants with Ph.D. degree without course work registered for/ completed Ph.D. will not get exemption from NET.** However, for those who registered for Ph.D. before 2009 but completed their degrees after 2009 and those who completed their Ph.D. before 2009 without course work must have two full length research papers in Journals having NAAS rating of 4 or above, the NET shall not be essential. For NAAS rating the rating for the year of publication in question shall be considered.

** Notwithstanding anything content in (iii) candidates, who are or have been awarded Ph.D. Degree in accordance with the University Grant Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations 2009 subject to the condition of producing a NET exemption Certificate as mentioned in Annexure-1, shall be exempted from the requirement of the minimum eligibility condition of NET/SLET/SET.

Note: All the qualifications must be from a recognized Indian University or from an accredited foreign university.

4. Terms and conditions:

A. Requirements for application-

- (1) The applicant (candidate) must be a citizen of India.
- (2) The applicant should have knowledge of Hindi.
- (3) The applicant must possess the prescribed necessary educational and other qualifications and fulfils are criteria as per the post applied for.
- (4) The age of the applicant falls within the prescribed age limit.
- (5) For reserved category, the applicant must be a native of Madhya Pradesh.
- (6) Aadhar registration of the applicant is mandatory.

B. Post related information and guidelines

- (1) The posts are advertised for of B.M. College of Agriculture, Khandwa under RVSKVV.
- (2) The selected candidates have to submit a bond of agreement on non-judicial stamp paper worth Rs. 500 for serving in the University for a minimum period of 3 years before joining any post. In case, if the candidate wants to leave or resigns from his/her services before the bond period, he/she shall have to pay his/her salary for the remaining period of 3 years in a single instalment to the University.
- (3) The services are terminable from either side by giving at least one month's advance notice in that regard or payment of three months salary in lieu of that after bond period.
- (4) The applications of such appointees will not be entertained or forwarded for outside employment by the Vishwa Vidyalaya during the bond period.
- (5) After the bond period after appointment, the services can be terminated by both the employer (university) and the candidate by giving at least one month's advance notice or by giving one months' salary in lieu of. At any point of time even during the bond period, in case the appointee is found ineligible, does not follow the service rules or the work is not found satisfactory, the University have the right to terminate or discontinue the services of the candidate in the University.
- (6) Appointment to the post will be purely temporary and applicants selected would be on probation as decided by the Vishwa Vidyalaya. The services of applicant are governed by the probation period rules of the University and Govt. of Madhya Pradesh. Further continuation of the services will be subject to the approval of the competent authority.
- (7) The service conditions will be subject to the prevailing rules and conditions of the University as well as the rules of Government of Madhya Pradesh as determined/adopted from time to time and those framed by the University from time to time.
- (8) The appointee to the post shall be governed by the "Naveen Paribhashit Pension Yojana 2005" introduced by the State Government of M.P. effective from 01.01.2005 and adopted by the Vishwa Vidyalaya. Employees working in different state organization (before 2005) of M.P. Govt., if recruited will be given pension (V.V. "Self-Finance Pension Scheme 1987") as per University and M.P. Govt. Rules.
- (9) If the appointee is already working in Central Government or other State Government organization, then pension/ share will be given as per NPS-2005 or on their request only employee contribution/share will be sent to their host organization as per rule.
- (10) The University reserves the right to increase/ decrease the number of posts or withdraw the posts advertised under any category at any time without giving any reason.



- (11) The services of the appointee may be transferred as per the administrative requirement of the university at any other station or college or unit.
- (12) Any kind of information regarding advertisement under the Right to Information Act 2005 will be made available only after the final result is declared. No information related to advertisement will be provided from the publication of the advertisement till the recruitment process is completed.

C. Educational Qualifications and Essentials

- (1) It is necessary to have all the complete and desired educational qualifications, experience certificates etc. at the time of application.
- (2) If any deficiency in educational qualification(s) or in other qualification(s) is/are found, then the application will be rejected.
- (3) All original documents are required to be produced at the time of interview or at the time of document verification.
- (4) All educational qualifications must be obtained from a recognized institute.
- (5) Fixed pay in Non Govt. Organizations, Private enterprises, Private colleges etc. shall not be considered equivalent to the mentioned pay scale in the advertisement.

D. Age Limit

- (1) According to Madhya Pradesh Government's circular number C-3-8/2016/13 dated July 04, 2019, the maximum age for posts of Assistant Professor is maximum 40 years.
- (2) Age relaxation shall be given to reserved category as per rules. There will be a maximum relaxation of 5 years in the age limit for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Corporation/ Board/ Autonomous Institution employees/ disabled persons/ women (unreserved/ reserved) etc.
- (3) There shall be no maximum age limit for RVSKVV/ JNKVV employees.

E. Application fee

- (1) An applications fee of Rs. 1000/- (for General and OBC applicants) and Rs. 500/- (for SC, ST and Divyang Applicants) with **non-refundable portal charges of Rs 200 + 18% GST** is applicable for all applicants, which can be paid online only.
- (2) Only the applicants, who are domicile of Madhya Pradesh will be eligible for exemption in application fee, if applicable.
- (3) The application fee should be paid at the time of application in online mode only. The application fee will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- (4) Applicants from other states shall be considered only under Unreserved (UR) category and they have to pay the prescribed application fee for unreserved category, even if they belong to the category of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Specially Abled Classes (Divyangjan).
- (5) If a candidate applies for more than one post, he/she will have to pay separate application fee for each post. If the application fee is not paid by him/her then his/ her application will be declared invalid and summarily rejected.
- (6) The University will not be responsible for delay in online fee payment, transaction failure, stoppage or return of the transaction or for non-payment. The application may be cancelled due to failure of the payment of application fee. However, if payment is made more than once for the same application, the payment received by mistake will be refunded after considering the request received along with proof.
- (7) Application fee shall not be refunded in any case.



F. General Rules and Regulations

- (1) The appointment of the applicant will be subject to the verification of latest character certificate, caste certificate, birth certificate and domicile certificate (if applicable) etc. issued by the competent authority.
- (2) In case forged or fake documents are received, the application will be summarily cancelled and necessary action will be taken as per government rules.
- (3) In case of any inadvertent error in the selection process, which may come to light at any stage even after the issue of appointment letter, the University shall have the right to modify or withdraw or cancel the interview call letter/ appointment letter at any point of time.
- (4) Making recommendation in any form will lead to rejection of the application. Canvassing/ bringing influence of any form directly or indirectly, will be a disqualification.
- (5) If any computer error/clerical error is noticed in the release of advertisement, release of interview letter or even after the issuing of the appointment order; the University reserves the right to correct, modify or withdraw the interview call letter/ appointment order.
- (6) In case of any lack of clarity or ambiguity regarding the rules of any section of this advertisement, the decision of the University will be final and binding.
- (7) In case of any kind of dispute, the jurisdiction of the court will be the High Court, Gwalior.

5. How to apply

- (1) Interested and eligible persons can apply in online mode for various posts on the University website www.rvskvv.net till the scheduled date and time. Advertisement related information and links will be available only on these portals till the prescribed date.
- (2) Before applying for the posts, applicants are advised to scanned all relevant documents required to claim marks as per model scorecard along with other documents required for basic information of applicant. The size of pdf should be less than 300 KB.
- (3) The scanned documents should be clearly readable. Name of applicant, his/ her contribution and details of claim should be highlighted before scanning. The marks/ score will not be allotted for such documents, which are not readable.
- (4) Following documents are required for applying:
 - (i) Latest passport size photograph in jpg format (maximum size – 100 KB).
 - (ii) Scanned signature in jpg format (maximum size – 100 KB).
 - (iii) No objection certificate from present employer, if any in pdf format (maximum size – 100 KB).
 - (iv) Valid Certificate for Date of birth (Marksheet of High School, Higher Secondary, Birth Certificate from Valid Authority, PAN Card etc. Aadhar card will not be accepted as birth certificate) in pdf format (maximum size – 300 KB).
 - (v) Latest and valid caste certificate issued in the prescribed proforma by the competent authority for the applicants applying for the posts under Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Class, Economically Weaker Section and Disabled (Divyang) category in pdf format (maximum size – 300 KB).
 - (vi) Income certificate for Other Backward Classes, Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) in pdf format (maximum size – 300 KB).
 - (vii) Domicile Certificate of Madhya Pradesh State for reserved categories in pdf format (maximum size – 300 KB).



- (viii) Original identity card (Aadhar card/ Passport/ Driving License/Voter card) of the applicant.
- (ix) Clear scanned copies of other necessary documents related to academic qualification, service experience, achievements etc. and other documents required to obtain marks/ score as per prescribed scorecard in pdf format (maximum size – 300 KB).
- (x) Character certificates, if required in pdf format (maximum size – 300 KB).
- (xi) Testimonials
- (xii) Any other document(s), which the applicant deems fit for application or obtaining marks/ score in pdf format (maximum size 300 KB).
- (5) Applicants are requested to upload only those certificates/ records/ documents, which are necessary for the application or obtaining marks. Application may be rejected or cancelled, if unnecessary/ irrelevant documents are being uploaded. Any objection/ representation will not be entertained in respect of the cancellation/ rejection due to this.
- (6) The information about two references *i.e.* two well-known persons to whom you are known alongwith testimonials in the pdf format should be uploaded while application.
- (7) Applicant must fulfil the essential qualifications, requirements and conditions indicated in the advertisement. Applicants are advised to satisfy themselves before applying that they fulfill all the requirements and possess the prescribed qualifications for the post(s) for which they are applying. Any inquiry seeking advice regarding eligibility will not be entertained.
- (8) Applicants working in Government and non-government organizations, public sector undertakings and autonomous bodies etc. will have to produce No Objection Certificate (NOC) while applying. The NOC shall also be produced during interview, if the applicant is found suitable for interview.
- (9) Only one or two pages of publications like research papers, books, certificates and documents etc., which are essential to prove the claim for score/ marks should be uploaded in the online application at the suitable section. Such pages must be scanned together in a single pdf (maximum size 100 KB) and then uploaded. Pages containing the name of applicants and title shall be included in the pdf.
- (10) The acceptance of the documents submitted by the applicant will be subject to verification by the competent authority/committee. If any document before or after appointment is found to be untrue, fake, inaccurate and defective; then the documents will be initially rejected and appropriate legal action will be taken against the concerned applicant by the university administration.
- (11) If the uploaded documents not fulfill the requirements or found not sufficient for providing the required information, then it may be rejected by the committee/ competent authorities and no marks will be given for that document.
- (12) Hard copies of any document, printouts of applications etc. should not be sent to the University.
- (13) Before final submission of the application, the applicant must ensure that the documents uploaded by him/her are fully uploaded and readable.
- (14) Any request shall not be entertained or considered for modification or amendment or addition of any information after final submission of the application.
- (15) No application/ request will be considered to extend the time / date of submission of the application. However, in case of any technical error, applicants may inform through email regarding resolving the same.



- (16) **Any kind of corrigendum, revision or cancellation regarding the advertisement will be published only on the website of the University, it will not be published in Newspapers. Therefore, all the applicants are advised to keep visiting the University website for updates regularly.**

6. Process for Recruitment

- (1) It is not necessary that the applicant having essential and desired qualification(s) shall be called for interview or considered for further process. The recruitment process generally involves- (A) Scorecard evaluation and (B) Interview of applicants obtaining higher ranking in the ratio of 3 to 8 for one post as described in point 6(3). **The recruitment process may involve a qualifying examination also as given in point 6(7) to 6(9).**
- (2) All applications received will be screened/evaluated/tested as per the model scorecard prescribed by the University and the only applicants obtained minimum score will be considered for the further process. The minimum score for qualifying the scorecard evaluation as given below:

Category	Minimum Score in Scorecard evaluation
Unreserved (UR)	50 percent
Economically Weaker Section (EWS)	45 percent
Other Backward Class	45 percent
Specially Abled Person (Divyangjan) of above category	45 percent
Scheduled Caste	40 percent

The applicants, who will not obtain the above minimum score in scorecard evaluation, will not be considered for the further process,

- (3) The eligible applicants will be considered for the interview in the ratio of 1:3 to 1:8 (post to applicant). After screening of applications, the top 3 to 8 applicants will be called for interview for one post (in the ratio of 3 to 8 applicants to one post) on the basis of their ranking/ merit obtained in the scorecard evaluation. If the number of posts are more than one, next three applicants will be added for each post. For example, 8 applicants for 1 post, 11 applicants for 2 posts, 14 applicants for 3 posts, 17 applicants for 4 posts, 20 applicants for 5 posts will be called for interview. If the number of posts exceeds this, the same sequence will be continued.
